It was discussed at our Annual Convention that there is a new opportunity available for Branches who want to take advantage of the revamped New Horizons program. It is a trial program, and it was developed in response to the need to inspire, inform and enrich KD members. It's purpose is to promote enthusiasm, rededication and growth to ensure the future of The King's Daughters and Sons.

In an effort to make New Horizons more accessible to a larger group of KD&S members and also non-members who might be attracted to the organization, the Executive Board has agreed to New Horizons on the Road. Beginning in 2017, two (2) one or two day sessions will be offered not at Chautauqua, but at areas where there are interested people (members and non-members). Besides learning more about our organization, this could be an opportunity for members to come together to share ideas and successes and failures they have encountered. Life members and members who participated in New Horizons at Chautauqua are not eligible to attend.

I am asking our Missouri Branch members their opinion as to whether we should consider hosting this program in Missouri. The following is expected of the host Branch, and there needs to be several people who would be willing to assist.

The host Branch (us) would be responsible to:

1. Publicize the event and guarantee at least 20 participants
2. Provide accommodations for the NHOTR leaders (2).
3. Secure the event location, arrange for the meals and provide requested audio-visual equipment
4. Branch or Circle leaders will be asked and expected to assist in the presentations.
5. Participants can and should be a combination of King's Daughters members and non-members.

There will be only two New Horizons on the Road sessions offered in 2017. I need your input to see if we would like to host this program sometime in 2017.

Please take the information to your Circle meetings and discuss this potential opportunity. If we want to request to be one of the two programs offered, we need to do so as soon as possible. Thank you for considering this opportunity.

Also the new website is up and going. It looks really nice and the information is updated. There is also a members only section under the HOME button. In order to be able to access this section, you will need to use the password. I am in the process of getting this password to your City Union President. They in turn, will be sharing it with their Circle Presidents; but if you want it beforehand, please call me at (573) 581-4237 or email me at nstack@wildblue.net.

Most recently a member of First Baptist Church in Mexico.

She enjoyed fishing, reading, crocheting, quilting, gardening and canning. Bernice would clean and cook any wildlife the boys brought in. She made the best dove pot pie. Bernice never let anything go to waste. Not sure patching blue jeans is something Bernice liked to do, but with 4 farm boys, she did a lot of patching and re-patching of blue jeans. Bernice raised chickens for eggs and also to butcher. She also had milk cows for the milk and cream but her husband's favorite, was the homemade ice cream she made. Bernice really enjoyed playing cards with family and friends, 10 point pitch and 6 handed pinochle being her favorite.

OUR MARCH FEATURED RESIDENT IS ARDYCE MAYES



Ardyce Mayes was born on March 1, 1926 in a small town in Minnesota. She was raised by her parents, Sam and Carrie Odegard. Her mother moved to the United States from Germany when she was 12 years old. Her paternal grandparents were from Norway. She was raised with her brothers Francis, Sylvan and sister Atheleen on a small dairy farm in Coleman, SD. She and her siblings attended the local country school. They enjoyed walking to school together, despite the tough winters, the temperatures were often below freezing, and there was as much as two feet of snow. Ardyce enjoyed being a farm girl, she loved being outside with her father and brothers. She was not afraid of hard work and often hand milked cows, and plowed the fields with horses.

When Ardyce was fourteen years old, her parents decided it was time to make a change. They gathered the family up and hit the road. They had no destination in mind but trusted that they would end up where they needed to be. Their journey took them to Vandalia, MO where their father started another small dairy farm. Ardyce attended Vandalia High School, and was elated that she no longer had to walk to school in trying conditions. After graduation, Ardyce moved to Washington D.C. to work for the Treasury Department for three years. Upon returning to Vandalia, she accepted an office position at the Mexico Florsheim Shoe Factory.

In 1949, mutual friends introduced Ardyce to the love of her life, Joe Mayes. They were married in a beautiful ceremony in front of family and friends in 1953. Joe was a farmer and worked at Kaiser Brick Plant. Ardyce resigned her position from the shoe factory to focus on starting a family. The newlyweds settled in Ladonia, MO. They had three sons Warren, Wayne and Terry. The boys were always very involved in sports, starting with Khoury league baseball when they were each 6 years old. Ardyce tried to make it to every home game and was very involved with all their school activities. Ardyce and Joe were blessed to celebrate 35 years of marriage; he passed away July 1988.

When Terry was in third grade, Ardyce decided to take a position at Community R-6 as the head cook of the school cafeteria in 1969. It was a challenging and rewarding position, her favorite part of the job was that she was on the same schedule as her boys. She enjoyed cooking from scratch for over 700 students. She became famous at the school for her cinnamon rolls. In 1991, she retired after 22 years of service. She volunteered for the Audrain Medical Center gift shop for ten years from 1991-2011. Ardyce would often see former R-6 students at the gift shop and they all wanted to know the same thing, if she had any cinnamon rolls.

The greatest joy of Ardyce's life has been raising her three boys. Warren is married to Debbie and works as a sports editor. Wayne and Terry are both accountants, all three boys live in the St. Louis area. They are very involved in their mother's life. Warren never forgets a birthday or valentine's card, Wayne is in charge of bringing in the quarters to donate, and Ardyce refers to Terry as her personal accountant. The boys threw their mother an amazing 90th birthday party at St. John's Lutheran church last year. She was impressed with how much detail and love they put into the event. There were family and friends from all over the country including, Minnesota, South Dakota, Michigan, Kansas and Arizona. Ardyce was overwhelmed by the turnout of over 70 people; she received approximately 90 birthday cards.

Arydce has always been very close to her sister, Atheleen. The two have always shared a very special bond. Atheleen is a mother of six, who worked at the Audrain County Courthouse until retirement. The sisters keep in close touch and speak every day on the phone. When Arydce recently had some technical issues with her phone, her first thought was to have someone contact her sister to let her know she was ok and that she would call her as soon as she was able to. As soon as her phone was fixed, she called Atheleen, whom was very happy to hear from her.

Arydce came to live at The King's Daughters Home on January 4, 2015. Ardyce enjoys reading her Mexico Ledger, Vandalia Leader and keeping up on current events at KDH and around town. She can often be seen playing bingo and socializing with friends and family. Ardyce is known for her caring personality and positive attitude. She attributes her longevity to hard work and the love of her friends and family, especially her three boys. On March 1, 2017, Ardyce will celebrate her 91st birthday. Congratulations Ardyce, and to many, many more birthdays to come!

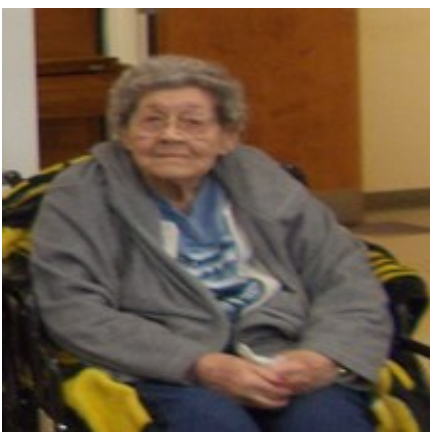

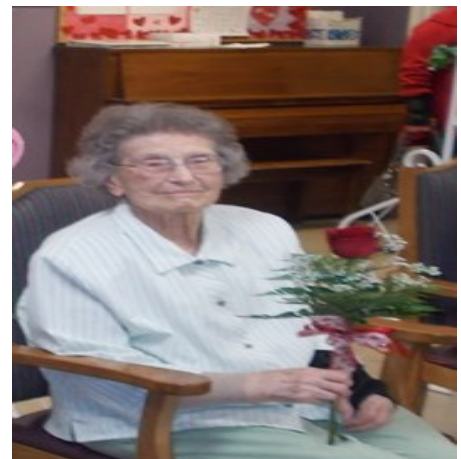

Crock Pot BBQ Meatballs

Ingredients:

1 1/2 lbs ground chuck
1 (5oz) can evaporated milk
2 eggs beaten
1/4 tsp. garlic powder
1/4 tsp. black pepper
1 tsp. salt
1/2 cup onion chopped
1 1/4 cup oats
1/2 cup water
3/4 cup brown sugar
1 cup sweet and smoky BBQ sauce

Directions:

Mix ground chuck with milk, eggs, garlic pow-
der, black pepper, salt, oats and onion togeth-
er. Mix rest of ingredients together and place
half in bottom of crock pot. Then make meat-
balls and place into crock pot. Cover with re-
maining BBQ sauce mixture, cook on high for
about two hours or until meat is done.
